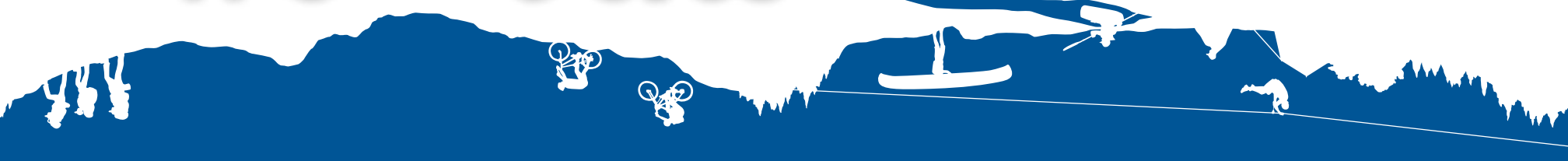

SUMMER FUN

Camp Dragon

White Beach; Okinawa: April 8–14, 2019

This water activities focused camp is untypical of most Council Camps, in that there is not a permanent site and White Beach is a U.S. Navy Base on Nakagusuku Bay and the Pacific Ocean. However, the program offered is similar to most Camps in the U.S.A offering most water related Merit Badges and activities. The facilities include administration, medical, trading post, quartermaster, showers, toilets, and mess hall. The Camp Staff hopes to make this year's camp a very memorable experience!

Pyeongtaek, South Korea : June 17–23, 2019

Located in Pyeongtaek, South Korea, Camp Tiger focuses on the traditional camp activities and merit badges with emphasis on Outdoor Survival skills. The camp staff partners with the U.S. Military to bring in experts and immerse the Scouts into outdoor cooking, first aid, rifle shooting, archery, land navigation, and wilderness survival as well as other unique activities and events. Come prepared for some new adventure!

High Adventure Camp

Thailand: July 28–August 4, 2019

One of three Council High Adventure camps, this year located in beautiful Chiang Mai Thailand and providing an 8 day, 7 night camp experience. Scouts will have the opportunity to choose from 40 Merit badges and be able to take part in mountain biking, hiking through the jungle or rock climbing. The week finale is a visit to a local Elephant rehabilitation center, where Scouts will study and ride these magnificent animals.

Camp Cost: \$600 for youth and adults
